This has positively impacted the PE curriculum – sports such as football and hockey can now be played during the winter months when previously there was no suitable surface. The larger area of the court has provided a more appropriate size for our KS3 pupils – for the development of their skills, gameplay and their fitness. The level, even and softer surface has supported our pupils in developing physical skills, such as dribbling, especially those pupils who find this more of a challenge.</p> <p>The multi-sport artificial surface has already increased sporting opportunities at break and lunch – the new surface provides a large space that is used for games – whatever the weather, across the entire academic year. This has also enabled the pupils who want to be involved in less structured physical play to continue using the hard playground area – and without the risk of balls flying unexpectedly at them.</p> <p>The pupils have responded so positively to the new space: They are organising their own games, practising their PE skills in an environment which more appropriately meets their needs.</p>
